

## Daily program

### **1<sup>st</sup> day, SATURDAY**

Embarkation in Venice between 15:00 and 18:00. Departure for Korčula at 19:00. Welcome drink and dinner on board.

### **2<sup>nd</sup> day, SUNDAY**

At 14:00 the ship sails into Korčula, a medieval town on the homonymous island. Take a walk through the old Korčula surrounded by medieval walls, discover the secrets of numerous civilisations that left their mark on the island, visit the birth house of Marco Polo. There will also be plenty of time to refresh in the clear blue waters of the Korčula archipelago.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> day, MONDAY**

Early morning arrival to Dubrovnik. Explore the southern rival of Venice and spend the whole day in a town that presents itself to its visitor as a unique open-air museum. Discover why George Bernard Shaw said: “Those who seek paradise on earth should come to Dubrovnik”. You will have the opportunity to visit the nearby islands of the archipelago of the Elaphites, known for their beautiful sandy beaches. Later, in the evening, enjoy dinner on board with Dalmatian cuisine specialities. Departure for Greece is scheduled for 19:00.

### **4<sup>th</sup> day, TUESDAY**

Corfu has been enchanting its visitors with its impressive landscapes and beaches. Visit its capital, a lively blend of Italian and Greek culture, and join the excursion to the Achilleion, former summer palace of the Empress Elisabeth of Austria. While the ship leaves Corfu, enjoy your evening with the tastes and scents of the “Greek Dinner”.

### **5<sup>th</sup> day, WEDNESDAY**

Sail in the morning through the extraordinary Kotor bay, once ruled by the Illirian queen Teuta. The ship will berth in Kotor, located at the furthest end of the bay under the high cliffs of Mount Lovćen. Discover old Kotor and the picturesque towns of the Montenegrin coast: Sveti Stefan, Budva and Miločer. Departure from Kotor is scheduled in the evening for an overnight sailing towards Split.

### **6<sup>th</sup> day, THURSDAY**

Roman Emperor Diocletian's Split awaits you in the heart of Dalmatia. Discover this 1700 years old city with its numerous cultural and historical memorials. The Diocletian's Palace, whose cellars are still rather well preserved, has been entered on the world heritage list of the UNESCO. Experience the beauty of the nearby ancient

towns of Solin and Trogir. After departure from Split, meet the Captain and enjoy an unforgettable “Captain’s Cocktail and Dinner”.

**7<sup>th</sup> day, FRIDAY**

The ship sails into Pula early in the morning. This 3000 years old city whose landmark is the magnificent Roman amphitheatre dating from the 1<sup>st</sup> century AD, is rich with valuable cultural and historical monuments which often provide the stage for famous artists. A visit to the nearby national park Brijuni – a chain of islands of extraordinary natural beauty and rich historical heritage, should not be missed. Depart from Pula to Venice at 13:30 hours. Sailing into Venice along St. Mark’s square is always an extraordinary experience. Spend your last evening on board with a view over this magical city on the lagoon.

**8<sup>th</sup> day, SATURDAY**
